Science Faculty

The Faculty aims to provide a stimulating, academically rigorous experience for all our students. We encourage team members to show initiative, creativity and innovation which is leading to an improvement in outcomes for all our students. The Faculty is committed to fully developing students' confidence in their own abilities and demonstrating that our subjects are rich, challenging and enjoyable. We want our students to be self-motivated, independent learners and we develop schemes of work that support this aspiration.

Accommodation and Resourcing

Our accommodation is exceptional, comprising a science suite of ten laboratories, all have been recently refurbished to a high standard. All of the laboratories have interactive whiteboards and visualisers which are networked with internet access. We also have 3 classrooms for non practical lessons. The Faculty has 60 chrome books which are a bookable resource for the department. The Faculty received generous capitation in addition to the resources made available through Science College status. It is well stocked with all the apparatus and equipment – much of it new – required to teach science to the highest level and our teaching staff can rely on technical help of a very high standard from three experienced technicians.

Curriculum

Science is taught in sets where students of similar ability can be stimulated and motivated to achieve their full potential.

- In years 9 to 11 students study GCSE biology, physics, chemistry and combined science, taught by a team of teachers with appropriate specialist knowledge and qualifications.
- In year 7 & 8 students study “science” and have the same teacher throughout the year for all 3 subjects.

In Key Stage 3 the department uses a scheme of work and assessment system designed by our team of experienced scientists in line with the AQA KS3 model. In Key Stage 4 a variety of texts and revision guides are employed. Most KS4 students are entered for AQA Combined Science. About 90 keen scientists take 3 individual sciences at GCSE by choosing science in one of their option blocks.

Our post-16 students currently study GCE (OCR) Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Level 3 Medical Science.

We have developed an outstanding relationship with our partner primary schools and a wide variety of initiatives have been successfully introduced. These include weekly timetabled year 5 and year 6 visits, year 5 science clubs, production of resources, CPD, parents' evenings and, for prize winners, attendance at our Awards Ceremony.



Teaching and Learning

Shire Oak Academy is strongly committed to develop a culture of high quality teaching and learning. The Shire Oak Framework for Excellence is a self-assessment and development tool for teachers & Faculties underpinning outstanding teaching and learning across the Academy. We have regular teaching and learning CPD sessions structured around the Teaching and Learning Framework for Excellence. We also have a weekly teaching and learning bulletins in which staff share their excellent strategies and resources with their colleagues.
