Dress Code Reminder

May I please take this opportunity to remind you of our Sixth Form Dress code. It is really important that students do not let standards slip throughout the year. Students must have a blazer or jacket every day and hoodies/coats are not a replacement for this.

Trousers <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Tailored trousers - Chino style trousers - Leggings and jeans should not be worn 	Tops <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A smart formal blouse or fitted shirt (must be long enough to cover the midriff and not low cut). - A collared shirt worn with a tie. - Blazers
Skirts & Dresses <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - To be an appropriate length, no shorter than an inch above the knee - Not to be made of a stretchy material 	Footwear <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Shoes must be smart leather type; plain dark boots must have no embellishments and not be more than knee high. - Doc Martens, Converse, Uggs, Rigger style boots and trainers should not be worn.
Makeup and hair <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Discreet and professional - Hair should be a natural colour and no extreme hairstyles! 	Jewellery <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - One ring on each hand - Stud earrings - No facial piercings (a small discreet nose stud is acceptable)

Attendance
